

2013 Pee Wee Reese (12 and Under) Pitch Count Addendum

Pitch counts will be utilized to determine the number of days rest required for pitchers in both recreational league games and travel games. Therefore, the Manager is responsible for assigning a coach or volunteer to track pitch counts during each game. The Home Team Manager shall report the pitch counts for both teams to the Division Coordinator after each game. The number of days rest will be determined in accordance with the table below, and consistent with the 2013 pitch count guidelines established by Little League Baseball:

Pitches Thrown	Required Days Rest
1 – 20	0
21-35	1
36-50	2
51-65	3
66-85	4

Example: A player who throws 36 pitches on a Monday is not eligible to pitch again until Thursday.

No pitcher shall throw more than 85 pitches.

No pitcher shall pitch on three (3) consecutive days.

The Division Coordinator shall provide a weekly pitch count report to the 12U Travel Team Manager(s) regarding travel pitchers used during recreational play.

Once a pitcher is taken out of a game, he/she may not return to the game as a pitcher but may play any other position. However, in the event that a pitcher has thrown more than 66 pitches in a game, that player may not play the position of catcher for the duration of that game.

Pitching distance shall be 50 feet 6 inches from the front of the rubber to the back of home plate.

Balks will be called. However, each new pitcher will be given one warning prior to enforcement. At the discretion of both Managers prior to the start of a game, this rule may be further modified as deemed appropriate.

Manager may only make two (2) trips to the mound per pitcher in an inning. However, on the second trip in the same inning, the manager must remove the pitcher. This rule includes trips to the mound by assistant coaches. A total of three (3) trips for each pitcher per game shall be allowed. However, on the third trip, the manager must remove the pitcher. This rule also includes trips by assistant coaches.
